Hand Carved Wooden Stamps

Things you may need:

Your wood block ~ ink pad, ink or paint ~ paper, fabric, card, item to print on ~ sponge or paint roller, ~ old towel, cloth, ~ Cleaning items.

Directions for use:

(Note: If using ink pad, simply dip press on ink pad and then press to paper.)

- 1. Find a nice flat, smooth area for your paper/item that you are going to print on. Sometimes the print will work better if you have a towel or sponge under it to give a bit of bounce (you will have to experiment). I use a magazine:)
- **2.** Apply some ink (or paint) to your roller (or sponge). Be careful not to have too much ink/paint on your roller/sponge as you will clog the carved out areas of your wood block.
- 3. Coat the wood block with an even layer of ink (or paint).
- **4.** Press the inked wood block onto the paper with your hands using even pressure. (Sometimes hitting the block can help distribute the paint)
- **5.** Carefully lift the wood block off the paper (or printed item) and admire your beautiful block print work.

Cleaning:

When finished clean off all excess paint. I wash my stamps under warm water. Dry your stamp straight away.

Extra tip:

The internet is a great tool for information. If you are looking for further techniques try an internet search on 'wood block printing techniques' or similar. You Tube is great for visual demonstrations.
